The Wilhelm Scream is a famous stock sound effect used in countless movies, from <i>Star Wars</i> to <i>Indiana Jones</i> .

The famous line "Here's looking at you, kid" from <i>Casablanca</i> was improvised by Humphrey Bogart.
The original script for <i>Pulp Fiction</i> was over 500 pages long.

Pixar Prowess

Pixar's Luxo Jr. (1986) was the first CGI short film nominated for an Academy Award.
Every Pixar movie contains the Pizza Planet truck, a recurring Easter egg.
The character Boo from <i>Monsters, Inc.</i> was voiced by a child who was recorded while playing, rather than reading lines.
The Incredibles was originally conceived as a traditionally animated film before Pixar decided to tackle it with CGI.

Animation Techniques

Traditional Animation	Hand-drawn animation, like classic Disney films.
Stop-Motion Animation	Involves physically manipulating objects and photographing them one frame at a time (e.g., <i>Wallace & Gromit</i>).
CGI Animation	Computer-generated imagery (e.g., <i>Toy Story</i>).
Rotoscoping	Animators trace over motion picture footage, frame by frame (e.g., <i>Waking Life</i>).

Midnight Movies

<i>The Rocky Horror Picture Show</i> is one of the most famous midnight movies, known for its interactive screenings.
<i>Eraserhead</i> directed by David Lynch, is a surrealist horror film that gained a cult following for its bizarre imagery.
<i>Pink Flamingos</i> by John Waters is another popular midnight movie notorious for its outrageous and transgressive content.

Sci-Fi Staples

Blade Runner (1982)	Directed by Ridley Scott, this dystopian sci-fi film is known for its visual style and philosophical themes.
Starship Troopers (1997)	Directed by Paul Verhoeven, this satirical military sci-fi film has garnered a cult following.
Gattaca (1997)	A biopunk science fiction film depicting a future society driven by eugenics.

TV Show Comebacks

<i>Arrested Development</i> was revived by Netflix after its original cancellation, becoming a pioneer for TV show revivals.
<i>Twin Peaks</i> returned after more than 25 years with David Lynch directing all episodes of the revival.
<i>Full House</i> was brought back as <i>Fuller House</i> , featuring many of the original cast members.
